STREET SWEEPER OPERATOR

DEFINITION

Under the general supervision, to clean the City streets using a street sweeper; and to operate other light and heavy equipment as required.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED

Exercises no supervision

EXAMPLES OF IMPORTANT AND ESSENTIAL DUTIES

Operate a street sweeper to clean City streets, gutters, and alleyways along assigned routes.

Prepare reports regarding completed routes and activities.

Clean and maintain the sweeper.

Perform general maintenance work as required.

OTHER JOB RELATED DUTIES

Perform related duties and responsibilities as assigned.

JOB RELATED AND ESSENTIAL QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge of:

Operational characteristics and maintenance requirements of the street sweeper and related equipment and tools.

Traffic laws, ordinances, and rules involved in street sweeping operations.

Occupational hazards and standard safety practices necessary in the area of work assigned.

Knowledge of:

City geography including the layout of routes.

Safe driving principles and practices.

Skill to:

Operate a street sweeper and street cleaning related equipment in a safe and effective manner.

Drive skillfully in maneuvering around cars.

Operate a motor vehicle safely.

Ability to:

Perform maintenance and cleaning of street sweeper.

Perform general maintenance duties as required.

Work independently in the absence of supervision.

Understand and follow oral and written instructions.

Establish, maintain, and foster positive and harmonious working relationship with those contacted in the course of work.

Experience and Training Guidelines

Any combination equivalent to experience and training that would provide the required knowledge, skills, and abilities would be qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge, skills, and abilities would be:

Experience:

Two years of experience performing general street, sanitation, or park maintenance duties including one year of heavy equipment operation.

Training:

Formal or informal education performing general street, sanitation, or park maintenance duties including one year of heavy equipment operation.

License or Certificate:

Possession of, or ability to obtain, an appropriate, valid driver's license.

Special Requirements

Essential duties require the following physical skills and work environment:

Ability to sit, stand, walk, kneel, crouch, stoop, squat, crawl, twist, climb, and lift 50 lbs.; exposure to cold, heat, noise, outdoors, vibration, mechanical hazards, and electrical hazards; ability to travel to different sites and locations.
